'Modernism Meets Upton Country Park'

It has been suggested that we make UPTON COUNTRY PARK the theme for the next DORSET ART WEEKS exhibition. The park has expanded recently and now hosts many more attractions and activities than it has ever done in the past. We are keen to make the exhibition as exciting as possible, both for ourselves and for our visitors - so we are adding a twist.

Choose a MODERN ART MOVEMENT that appeals to you, research it, find out what you can about it and apply that approach/treatment to one of the many aspects and activities found at Upton Country Park. Apart from the gardens, tearooms and petanque players the park also hosts music evenings, steam fairs and fireworks; there are new walks, ponds, flora and fauna, reed beds, people at play and new vistas have opened up all over which can be rendered in all weathers and seasons.

Some of the groups of modern artists and Modern Art movements that might appeal are: Post-Impressionism, Pointillism, The Nabis, Constructivism, Expressionism, Fauvism, Cubism, Futurism, Orphism, Surrealism... We are sure you can think of others. Don't be daunted - just do a little research on the internet and look for the modernist paintings/sculpture that you find beautiful and exciting and ask yourself why they appeal and how can I apply that to the theme.

This is quite an open brief. As a very rough guide, the roots of Modern Art lie in the late 19th century and flourished through the first half of the 20th century. Further notes are in our March newsletter.
